INDIGOS PLAY BENEFITS FOR NATIVE PEOPLES


Early February found Amy and Emily on the road in the midwest cities of Des Moines, Iowa, Madison, Wisconsin, and Minneapolis, Minnesota, on the "Honor The Earth Tour". Proceeds from the shows went to the Indigenous Women's Network, the Point Hope Project, the Anishinaabe Niijii, the White Earth Land Recovery Project, and the Midwest Treaty Network, groups which work "on the frontlines in defense of Native rights and protecting homelands from further destruction and exploitation", and fight "ecologically destructive projects like strip mining, clearcutting, and toxic wastes dumping in Native communities". In addition, February saw Emily and Amy make several quest apperances with local artists in Atlanta, and play a "by invitation only" show for their friends at Eddie's Attic on February 10th. Ashley and Mark opened the Eddie's Attic show, reports are it was a tremendous.

The first week of March the Indigos will be heading for Europe, specific dates for the tour are not available at this time. April 29th will find them playing the New Orleans Jazzfest, and May 2nd (not March as reported in issue #9) they will play the Sunfest in Florida. There are two conflicting reports regarding their plans after Europe, one has them taking some time off, and the other has them embarking on a club tour for April, May, and June.

PLACES TO GO...

Eat More Records - 1799 Briarcliff Road

I always begin my vacations in Atlanta here, stopping by to hang out with Jinny, catch up on what's been going on and who will be playing while I am there, and pick up any new CD's or cassettes that have come out since the last time I visited. Stop by and say "hi".

Emory Bookstore - Oxford Road

Located across the street from Emory University, this is a great place to stop in and pick up your Emory t-shirt and postcards of the campus to send to your friends who couldn't make the trip. The campus itself is better seen on foot, it has beautiful old buildings that are surrounded by huge pine trees.

Little Five Points - Euclid Ave. at Moreland Ave.

A cool place to spend an afternoon, it has a collection of cool shops, selling everything from vintage clothing and jewelry to used furniture to frisbees. Fellini's restaurant now occupies the building that used to house the Little Five Points Pub. Eat Your Vegetables is a great place to stop and have lunch, and their is a stamp machine and mailbox at the Little Five Points Drugstore where you can mail your postcards.

Rainbow Foods - NE corner of Decatur Road and Clairmont Ave.

An all natural health food grocery store with a small sidewalk cafe. If it's healthy you can find it here. For those a little less health consious, there is a Baskin-Robbin's a few doors down and on the NW corner of this intersection is a great little Italian place called Benedetti's (or something close to that).

Decatur Square - Downtown Decatur between the Courthouse and the MARTA station.

A great place to stretch your legs and get some fresh air, this sight is also the home of the Decatur on the Square concert series which is held each May. In 1987 Amy and Emily played here. Don't forget to give the statue of Mr. Decatur a pat on the head and a hug for good luck.

Eddie's Attic - McDonough Street

Right around the corner from the Decatur Square, Eddie's is the place you will probably be spending most of your nights. His place not only features the best in local talent, it also has cold beer, great food, a pool table, darts, and a second story patio for when the weather is nice. In addition, all of the cover charges collected each night (usually \$3-\$5) go directly to the artists that are playing that night.

Trackside Tavern - College Ave.

Hard to spot from the street, this bar used to be home to Eddie and all the great artists that now play at his Attic. Unfortunately it has now been converted into a sportsbar, I haven't been in it since it changed over, it used to have a red brick interior, dark wooden tables and boothes, a gold record from "Indigo Girls", and a tiny little stage in one corner where the best of Atlanta's talent used to come and play. It is housed in a grey building located on the SW corner of College and Candler/Trinity. The entrance and parking are around back.

Avondale Pizza - College/Avondale Road

If you head east on College from Trackside you will soon see Avondale Pizza on your left. In addition to having great pizza, this is a great place to spend and a nice afternoon with friends drinking beer and watching the world go by out on the patio, then heading up the street to Eddie's to catch a show. Of all the places I have eaten in Atlanta, this is my favorite.


Other Places Of Interest

If you are near the south end of Downtown and have a few extra minutes, be sure and drive by the Garnett Street Warehouse on Garnett street. This is where the rooftop footage in the video "Closer To Fine" was shot.

If you have an afternoon to spare, Stone Mountain is only 15 miles east of Downtown Atlanta and has a beautiful lake and forest, an old train that takes you around the base of the mountain, and a cablecar to the top which gives you a great view of Atlanta.

North of Atlanta is the mountain city of Helen, a re-creation of and old German village. And yes, they do sell cider by the roadside.

For more information on fun things to do in Atlanta, I suggest picking up one of the many travel guides that are available at bookstores across the country.





Proceeds from the CD sales go to the Decatur Cooperative Ministry, "an ecumenical collaborative of 24 Decatur Area Churches, spearheading community projects which eventually function as independent self-sustaining programs helping the needy of Decatur and DeKalb County". A great set benefitting a great cause.




